San Jose State University Football Game Notes

Justin Holmes, Maurice McKnight and Andre Chachere served as team captains for the Hawaii game.

San Jose State's 26 points are the most points scored in a game since the 34-13 win over Cal Poly.

The Spartans had a season-high 504 yards of total offense.

Montel Aaron returned to the San Jose State lineup as the starting quarterback for the first time since the Utah game on September 16. He threw for a season-high 322 yards completing 17-of-27 passes with an interception for two touchdowns. Aaron also rushed 10 times for 1 yard.

San Jose State had a lead in a game for the first time since the September win over Cal Poly when the Spartans led 3-0 early in the first quarter and 10-0 at the end of the quarter.

Running back Tyler Nevens, defensive lineman Nico Aimonetti and safety Jonathan Lenard, Jr., made their first major college start for San Jose State.

Bryce Crawford replaced Michael Carrizosa as the team's punter and kickoff specialist in the Hawaii game. Crawford punted three times averaging 35.3 yards a punt and kicked off five times with four touchbacks.

Rahsheed Johnson's first catch of the season was a 15-yard touchdown. He finished with four receptions for 93 yards and two touchdowns. Johnson would score a third touchdown on a 96-yard kickoff return.

Johnson's kickoff return for a touchdown was the first by a San Jose State player since Tyler Ervin took a kickoff and returned it for a TD against UTSA in the 2012 season.

Four Spartans had their season long pass reception in the Hawaii game. First was Tyler Nevens with a 31-yard catch in the first quarter. Tre Hartley was next with a 27-yard reception in the second quarter. Josh Oliver's 21-yard and JaQuan Blackwell's 48-yard plays were season longs for each player.

Bryce Crawford has field goals from 28 and 52 yards. Crawford now is the San Jose State single-season and career record holder for field goals of 50 or more yards. Crawford made his fourth field goal of 50 or more yards to close out the first half of the Hawaii game. He

missed his final try of the game from 51 yards. Crawford is 4-of-6 from 50-yards this season and 10-of-12 overall.

Frank Ginda was the Spartans' leading tackler with nine stops. It was the first time this season he was credited with fewer than 10 tackles in a game.
