



Game Notes Fresno State vs. San José State October 7, 2017



San Jose State University Football Game Notes

San Jose State's announced attendance of 18,483 for the Fresno State game was a season-high.

The San Jose State loss to Fresno State was its first to the Bulldogs since 2014. Fresno State defeated San Jose State, 38-24.

Wide receiver JaQuan Blackwell attempted his first pass attempt of the season. His pass was intercepted by Fresno State's Jaron Bryant. Blackwell finished the game as the Spartans' top receiver with five catches for 41 yards.

Josh Oliver's touchdown reception was his first of the season.

For the second week in a row, freshman Tyler Nevens was San Jose State's leading rusher. He finished with a season-high 99 yards on 21 carries.

Frank Ginda notched his eighth game this season and 10th in a row with 10 or more tackles. He finished with a game-high and personal single-game best 19 tackles. Ginda increased his season total to 106 in seven games.

Cornerback Jermaine Kelly had a season-high eight tackles in the Fresno State game.

Bryce Crawford became the first San Jose State kicker to convert three field goals of 50 or more yards in a season with his 51-yard field goal in the Fresno State game. He kicked a 51-yarder at Utah, a career-long 53-yarder against Utah State and another 51-yard field goal against Fresno State.

Punter Michael Carrizosa averaged 45.8 yards per punt against Fresno State. As a team, San Jose State had a net punting average of 45.2 yards per punt.

Rahsheed Johnson saw his first action of the season in the Fresno State game as a kickoff returner and a reserve wide receiver.
