### **San Jose State University Football Game Notes**

For the second time this season, San Jose State had at least 80 offensive snaps in a game. The Spartans ran 82 offensive plays with 33 running plays and 49 pass attempts. San Jose State had a season high 88 plays in the season opener vs. USF.

San Jose State passed for a season-high 315 yards in the UNLV game. The team's previous season best was 278 yards against USF.

Tre Walker became the second San Jose State player this season with at least 100 pass receiving yards. Walker caught a personal season-high eight passes for 104 yards.

Walker was one of three Spartans to have a season-high in pass receiving against UNLV. JaQuan Blackwell matched Walker with a season-high eight catches including an 11-yard touchdown reception. Tight end Josh Oliver had a single-game best five receptions.

Bryce Crawford extended his streak of made field goals to 17 with his 28-yard first quarter field goal. His streak ended near the end of the first quarter when he missed from 52 yards. Crawford went on to make a 23-yard field goal midway through the second quarter.

San Jose State's 17-play, 75-yard drive that resulted in Crawford's 23-yard field goal involved the most plays in a Spartan drive this season.

Running back Tyler Nevens was the Spartans' leading rusher with a season-high 94 yards on 17 carries.

San Jose State was the victim of a blocked punt attempt for the second week in a row. The blocked punt resulted in a 2-yard touchdown run by UNLV's Lexington Thomas.

Quarterback Josh Love had career-highs in pass completions (30) and passing yardage (315). The UNLV game marked the first time this season the Spartans played a game with one quarterback.

Linebacker Frank Ginda now has been credited with 10 or more tackles in eight consecutive games going back to last season after being credited with a game-high 14 stops in the UNLV contest. Ginda had one of the Spartans two sacks in the game and 1.5 tackles for loss.

The UNLV game marked the first time this season the San Jose State offense did not yield a quarterback sack.
