San Jose State University Football Game Notes

San Jose State team captains were #2 **Tim Crawley**, #4 **Christian Tago**, #10 **Maurice McKnight**, #49 **Shane Smith**.

Quarterback **Kenny Potter**, offensive tackle **Nate Velichko**, wide receiver **Rahshead Johnson**, running back **Brandon Monroe** and defensive tackle **Bryson Bridges** missed the Iowa State game due to injuries.

Josh Love, **Joseph Melo** and **Bailey Gaither** made their first major college starts for San Jose State. Love started for quarterback **Kenny Potter**. Melo opened at a defensive tackle spot for **Bryson Bridges**. Gaither started as a wide receiver for **Rahshead Johnson**.

Linebacker **Christian Tago** made his first appearance in 2016 and started in place of **Will Ossai**. Tago missed the first three games of the season recovering from a knee problem. He finished the game with three tackles.

Iowa State scored 23 points off of San Jose State's four interceptions. The Cyclones scored each time they took away the ball from the Spartans. San Jose State did not score after its one fumble recovery.

Love became the fifth San Jose State freshman to start a game at quarterback since the reinstatement of freshman eligibility in 1972. The most recent Spartan freshman to start a game at quarterback prior to Love was **Adam Tafra** in the final game of the 2004 season at Fresno State.

The last time San Jose State had four passes intercepted in a game was in a 38-28 loss at Louisiana Tech on October 29, 2011.

For the second consecutive game, **Josh Love** threw a touchdown pass when he connected on a 15-yard play with **Tim Crawley**.

The Iowa State game marked the first time this season San Jose State was unable to register a quarterback sack of its opponent.

Zamore Zigler notched his second 100-plus yard rushing game of the season with 104 yards on a season-high 24 carries.

Bryce Crawford made it 4-for-4 converting all his kicks this season. One of 15 kickers in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) to make all his kicks through week three, Crawford kicked a 22-yard field goal and a point after touchdown at Iowa State.

San Jose State's 34:28 time of possession at Iowa State trails only the 35:00 in this season's Portland State game.
