

2016 MOUNTAIN WOMEN'S BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP QUARTERFINAL #2 (March 8, 2016)

GAME NOTES

Final Score: No. 5 Seed New Mexico 65, No. 4 Seed San José State 51

- Tuesday was the first meeting between San José State and New Mexico in MW Tournament play. New Mexico now leads the all-time series 7-1, after splitting the regular season matchup, with both teams winning on their home floor.
- No. 5 New Mexico advances to the semifinals Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. The No. 5 seed is 15-15 all time in the MW Tournament.
- The first quarter of today's game, marked just the second time San José State has scored less than 10 points in a quarter. The first came in a 71-57 loss at New Mexico in which they were held to just 6 points in the first quarter.
- San José State falls to 2-3 in MW Tournament play, while New Mexico improves to 28-11.
- To end the second quarter, San José State went 3 minutes and 46 seconds without a point. During which they were 0-4 from the field, which helped to power New Mexico to a 12-point halftime lead.
- San Jose Staté's 20 first half points are the fewest in a game this season for the Spartans.
- New Mexico's win marks the 10th time that a 5 seed has advanced to the semifinals, 5 coming in the last 6 years.
- New Mexico's Khadijah Shumpert (Sr.) set a MW Tournament record for field goals made in a Second Round game with 11, the previous record 10 set in 2011.
- New Mexico's Khadijah Shumpert (Sr.) tied the MW Tournament record for points in a Second Round game with 26 points, done twice before in 2015 and 2011.
- New Mexico's Khadijah Shumpert (Sr.) set a MW Tournament record for field goal percentage in a Second Round game with .733 percent (11-15) besting the previous mark of .692 percent (9-13) in 2014.
- San Jose Staté's Dezz Ramos (Jr.) set a MW Tournament record for field goal attempts in a Second Round game besting the previous mark of 20 set in 2014 and 2011.
- No 5. New Mexico win against No 4. San Jose State, marks the first upset of the 2016 MW Tournament
- New Mexico's 14-point win was the 5th consecutive double digit win in the 2016 MW Tournament.
