

## Game Notes Boise State vs. San José State November 27, 2015



San Jose State University Game Notes

The San Jose State University equipment bearers at the start of the game were Andre Chachere with the sword; Tony Popovich, the sledgehammer; and Jarrod Lawson, the tool box.

San Jose State finished the 2015 season with a 5-7 win-loss record and a 4-4 mark in Mountain West play. The Spartans can finish in a second-place tie in the West Division with Nevada if the Wolf Pack loses at San Diego State on November 28.

The 2015 team became the second San Jose State squad to rush for at least 2,000 yards and rush for 20 or more touchdowns and pass for at least 2,000 yards and 20 touchdowns. The Spartans finished with 2,189 yards and 23 touchdowns and passed for 2,793 yards and 20 touchdowns.

Kenny Potter finished with a season-high 336 passing yards against Boise State. It was his third consecutive 300-yard passing game and the fourth for him this season. Potter completed 68.5 percent of his passes for 1,895 yards and 14 TDs.

Tight end Billy Freeman scored on a 35-yard touchdown pass – his longest play of the season. Freeman had a single-game best 7 receptions for 102 yards and a touchdown. The 102 yards marked his second career game with at least 100 receiving yards. Freeman finished the season as the team leader in the major receiving categories with 47 receptions for 581 yards and six touchdowns.

Tyler Ervin finished the season with 2,410 all-purpose yards and became just the second San Jose State player to average at least 200.0 yards per game at 200.83. Ervin also extended his school record career total in all-purpose running to 5,919 yards.

Tim Crawley finished the season scoring five touchdowns in the final three games. Crawley's 3-yard touchdown catch was the last score by the Spartans in 2015. Crawley had 5 receptions for 51 yards and a touchdown in the game. His season totals of 39 receptions for 424 yards and five touchdowns are individual season bests in all three categories.

Hansell Wilson matched his season high of six receptions and had a career best 98 receiving yards against Boise State. Wilson became the fifth San Jose State player in 2015 to catch at least 30 passes with 34 receptions for 464 yards and four touchdowns.

Safety Maurice McKnight led all players with a career-best 16 tackles including a single-game best 13 solo tackles. McKnight had 95 tackles and 1.0 tackles for loss.

Dominic Barnes notched his first career quarterback sack in the Boise State game.

Freshman Bryson Bridges made his first start of the season at a defensive tackle position. He was credited with an assisted tackle.
