Game Notes

- Weather at game time was 82 degrees and sunny. Wind was from the south at 5 mph.
- The game aired on Pac-12 Networks. Jim Watson was the play-by-play announcer; Mike Lamb was the analyst and Drea Avent was the sideline reporter.
- It was the sixth meeting between the teams. OSU leads the series 4-2.
- San Jose State won the toss and elected to receive. The Beavers kicked off from the north end zone.
- Oregon State captains were Josh Mitchell, Rommel Mageo, Kellen Clute and Kyle Peko. San Jose's captains were Christian Tago, Tyler Ervin, Jimmy Pruitt and Wes Schweitzer.
- Oregon State wore white jerseys, white pants and white helmets. San Jose State wore blue jerseys, gold pants and blue helmets.
- Attendance for the game was 34,573. It was the largest crowd ever for an OSU-San Jose State game at Reser/Parker or Spartan stadiums. The previous high was 24,342 at then-Parker Stadium for a 36-34 OSU victory exactly 28 years ago, on Sept. 19, 1987.

Oregon State Team Notes

- Gary Andersen improved to 2-1 at OSU and to 51-39 in 7-plus seasons as a head coach. He is 32-10 since 2012, inclusive.
- The Beavers have now won 111 games in the 21st century, third-most among Pac-12 teams in the conference during that entire span. Utah has 124 wins in the 21st century but the bulk of them came between 2000 and 2010, when the Utes played in the Mountain West Conference.
- Sophomore stud linebacker Manase Hungalu and nickel back Devin Chappell made their first career starts for the Beavers.
- The Beavers scored 21 points in the third quarter. It was the most points on one quarter since they scored 27 in the fourth quarter against Washington on Nov. 23, 2013.
- Collins (114) and Barrs-Woods (151) each rushed for 100 yards. It was the 15th time in school history that two or more Beavers rushed for 100 yards in the same game.
- The Beavers set season-highs in rushing (303), passing (135) and total offense.
- The Beavers rushed for 305 yards. It was their first time over the 300-yard mark since they gained 323 in a Oct. 11, 2008 win over Washington State.
- The Beavers have now won 111 games in the 21st century, third-most among Pac-12 teams that have been members of the conference during that entire span. Utah has 126 wins in the 21st century but the bulk of those wins came when the Utes played in the Mountain West Conference.

Oregon State Individual Notes

- Quarterback Seth Collins scored his first career touchdown on a 4-yard run with 6:21 remaining in the first quarter. He added a 10-yard TD run with 5:15 left in the third quarter.
- Collins had a career-long run of 30 yards in the second quarter, eclipsing his previous long of 24 yards.

- Punter Nick Porebski had a career-long 53-yarder in the third quarter. His previous best before Saturday was 49 yards; he also had punts of 50 and 51 yards in the second quarter; each was a career-long at that time.
- Tailback Storm Barrs-Woods scored his 25th career rushing touchdown with 10:11 remaining in the second quarter to tie Bill Enyart (1966-68) for fifth place on OSU's all-time list.
- Barrs-Woods rushed for 151 yards, it was his seventh career 100-yard game. He now has 2,477 career yards, sixth all-time. Next to pass is Dave Schilling, who gained 2,522 yards from 1969-71.
- Barrs-Woods had a season-high 38-yard run in the third quarter. It was also OSU's longest run from scrimmage in 2015.
- Tight end Noah Togiaj had his first career reception, a four-yard catch in the fourth quarter.
- Linebacker Ricky Ortiz, switched from fullback just this past week, had his first career interception in the fourth quarter.
- Placekicker Garrett Owens missed a 48-yard field goal in the second quarter to snap his streak of nine consecutive makes over the past two seasons. It was his first miss from 40-49 yards in five career attempts.
- Linebacker Manase Hangalu had a career-high 11 tackles in his first start. He had three in OSU's first two games.

- Linebacker Rommel Mageo had a 11 tackles. He now has 30 in three games.
