

2015 MOUNTAIN WEST WOMEN'S BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP SEMIFINAL #1 (March 11, 2015)

GAME NOTES

Final Score: No. 4 Seed Boise State 76, No. 8 Seed San José State 67

- Boise State will face the winner of No. 2 New Mexico and No. 3 Fresno State, marking the first appearance by the Broncos in the MW Tournament Championship game
- Boise State becomes the first team in the last 11 MW Tournament semifinal games (2010-present) to advance to the championship game despite trailing at the half (32-30)
- The No.4 seed is now 5-2 all-time in MW Tournament semifinal games and 1-3 in championship games with New Mexico being the only team to win a title as a No. 4 seed
- The No. 8 seed is now 4-16 in MW Tournament play, with SJSU being the first No. 8 seed to advance to the semifinals in MW Tournament history
- Boise State now leads the series 15-12, after winning two of three this season
- In the first two meetings vs. Boise State this season, SJSU recorded 22 made 3-pointers. In today's matchup the first 12 Spartan points came from beyond the arc, including 3 of their first 4 shots of the game. SJSU was 8-27 from 3-point land in the game
- SJSU recorded 32 3-pointers in three MW Tournament games this year, breaking the record of 31 set in 2014 by Fresno State. Cunnigan's (SJSU) trifecta at the 1:14 mark of the second half broke the record
- The Spartans also broke the MW Tournament record of 3-point FG attempted with 77, breaking the previous mark of 71 (CSU, 2014; Utah, 2005)
- The Spartans also set the new MW Tournament record for FG attempts with 217 (211, Utah, 2011)
- The teams battled through 12 ties and 6 lead changes. Boise State took the lead for good, 59-58, at the 4:32 mark of the second half. The Broncos sealed the win despite holding the lead for only 5:53 in the game
- Cunnigan (SJSU) entered the game today with the most made FG in the tournament with 17, but the Broncos held her to 0-9 from the field in the first half. She responded with 15 second half points, marking her 31st double figure scoring game of the year
- Woodberry (SJSU) leads all scorers in this year's MW Tournament with 54 points. Her 12-3 pointers in this tournament were one shy of the record (Rodrigues, Utah, 2011)
- Woodberry (SJSU) recorded her 18th double figure scoring game this season, including five straight
- Shaw (Boise State) recorded her sixth double figure scoring game this season with a career high 20 points. After being held to four points in a loss at SJSU, Shaw proceeded to record her two highest scoring outputs of the season against the Spartans (18 in a win on 3/3/15)
- Weaver (Boise State) notched her 23rd double figure scoring game with 11 points today
- Brooke Pahukoa (Boise State) recorded her 15th double figure scoring game of the year with 19 points
