San Jose State Football Game Notes

Joining San José State team captains center David Peterson and defensive Travis Raciti are defensive back Dasheon Frierson and running back Shane Smith.

Offensive guard Jeremiah Kolone returned to the starting lineup after missing the Navy and Colorado State games due to injury.

Eugene Taylor started as a defensive end in place of Cedric Lousi who was injured in the November 1 Colorado State game. Taylor was injured on Marteze Waller's 44-yard touchdown run in the first quarter to open the scoring.

Jabari Carr's first-quarter, 86-yard pass touchdown reception was the eighth longest pass in San Jose State history. Carr had his first two-touchdown game of his career with his 4-yard touchdown catch in the third quarter.

Carr had his first 100-plus yard reception game of the season and the second of his career with a team-high six receptions for a career-best 143 yards. He also moved into fifth place on the San José State list for career receptions with 147.

Quarterback Joe Gray passed for a career-high 350 yards – his fourth consecutive game passing for 300 or more yards.

Running back Tyler Ervin now has three rushing touchdowns of 50 or more yards this season after his 51-yard burst in the first quarter to tie the score at 7-7. Ervin was the Spartans' leading rusher with 76 yards on 13 carries.

Cornerback Jimmy Pruitt came up with his first interception of the season in the second quarter against Fresno State.

Linebacker Christian Tago led the Spartans in tackles with a game-high 13 tackles. It is his third game this season with 10 or more tackles.

Defensive tackle Travis Raciti matched his single-game career high of eight tackles in the Fresno State game. He was credited with the team's only quarterback sack and had 2.0 tackles for loss. The Fresno State game marked the third game in the last four in which he had a quarterback sack.

Linebacker Vince Buhagiar had nine tackles including one for a loss to put him over 300 tackles for his career. He now has 306 tackles in his three-plus seasons at San José State.

Fresno State became the first team this season to pass for more than one touchdown in a game against San Jose State. The Bulldogs threw for 207 yards and three touchdowns. Coming into the game, the Spartans yielded only two touchdown passes in the first eight games.
