San Jose State Football Game Notes

Game captains: WR Tim Crawley and DE Cedric Lousi join C David Peterson and DT Travis Raciti as captains for the Navy game.

The San Jose State-Navy series finished even at 2-2. The Spartans won the first two games and the Midshipmen took the most recent two in the series.

A.J. Samataua made his first major college start in the Navy game. Samataua replaced **Jeremiah Kolone** as the Spartans' starting left guard.

Navy's 41 points are the most points scored by a San Jose State opponent since the 59-13 loss at Auburn on September 6.

Navy's 423 rushing yards are the tenth most by a San Jose State opponent in a game. In 2013, the Midshipmen rushed for 432 yards in their 58-52 win over the Spartans in San Jose.

Simon Connette made his first start of the season at a linebacker position. He replaced **Brad Kuh** as a starter. In the last three games, Connette is the third different starter joining **Vince Buhagiar** and **Christian Tago** as San José State's starting linebackers. Isaiah Irving was the other starting linebacker in the UNLV win on October 4.

For the first time, quarterback **Joe Gray** threw three touchdown passes in a game with his 251-yards, three touchdown performance at Navy.

Jimmy Pruitt's fumble recovery on Navy's first offensive play of the game was his second of the season.

Tight end **Billy Freeman** extended his streak of pass receptions in a game to 18 with a second-quarter reception prior to his first touchdown catch of the season – a 6-yard play giving San Jose State a 10-7 lead.

Jabari Carr moved into seventh place on the San Jose State career receiving list in the Navy game. Carr began the day with 132 catches and passed Tuati Wooden (2000-03) who had 133 receptions.

Tim Crawley notched a single-game career highs eight receptions for 102 yards in the Navy game. Crawley recorded his first 100-plus receiving yardage game of his career.

Vince Buhagiar notched his ninth career game of 10 or more tackles in the Navy contest with a career-high 14 tackles. **Christian Tago** recorded the fifth game of his career with 10 or more tackles finishing with 11 stops.
