

Game Notes Nevada vs. San José State September 27, 2014



San Jose State Game Notes

C David Peterson, DT Travis Raciti, DT Nate Falo and WR Tyler Winston served as team captains.

Joe Gray made his first start at quarterback for San Jose State.

Tim Crawley made his first start of the season as a running back. In 2013, Crawley started at running back for the Hawaii and Colorado State victories. This season, Crawley started as a slot receiver in the Auburn and Minnesota games.

After a week at Minnesota in which San Jose State played a penalty-free game, the Spartans committed a season-high nine penalties against Nevada.

San Jose State rushed for a season-high 170 yards against Nevada.

In the last three games, seven San Jose State passes were intercepted.

Tim Crawley's 24-yard touchdown run is a career long. His previous long run was 18 yards in the 2012 game at Hawaii. The rushing touchdown was the Spartans' first since the season-opener against North Dakota.

Billy Freeman matched his career-high of six receptions in the Nevada game. Freeman also extended his streak of consecutive games with a pass reception to 16 games.

In the last two games, San Jose State allowed 71 passing yards (7 at Minnesota and 64 vs. Nevada). Nevada quarterback Cody Fajardo passed for a career low 64 yards completing 10-of-18 passes.

For the second week in a row, Austin Lopez attempted a field goal exceeding 50 yards. His attempt was short. Lopez did convert a 32 yard field goal giving him 42 for his career. He is one behind San Jose State career leader Jared Strubeck, who converted 43 field goals during the 2005 through 2008 seasons.

Nevada came into the game with seven quarterback sacks in its first three games, but did not get any in its win over San Jose State.
