



San Jose State Post Game Notes

- Quarterback David Fales, offensive guard Ryan Jones, defensive tackle Travis Raciti and linebacker Keith Smith served as San Jose State game captains.
- San Jose State had its highest scoring first quarter of the season scoring 14 points.
- The Spartans' 312 rushing yards were the most since rushing for 476 yards in a 44-10 win over Louisiana Tech on October 28, 2006.
- Jarrod Lawson became the first San Jose State freshman to record back-to-back 100-plus yard rushing games. Lawson rushed for 128 yards in the October 26 Wyoming win and a season-high 187 yards against UNLV.
- Thomas Tucker's two 37-yard runs and his 94 yards rushing are season bests.
- Chandler Jones makes it four TD receptions in the last two games with a 13-yard catch to open the scoring. Jones is the school-record holder with 24 career touchdown receptions.
- For the third game in a row, Bené Benwikere came up with a pass interception. Benwikere now is tied for fourth place on the San Jose State career list 13. His next interception will tie him with Ken Thomas, Gerald Jones and Sherman Cocroft as the Spartans' career leader.
- Austin Lopez had his fifth multi-field goal game of the season making attempts of 20 and 44 yards. He now is 13-of-16 for the season.
- Forrest Hightower came up with San Jose State's second interception of the game – his first of the season and the second of his career.
- San Jose State's two interceptions were turned into 14 points by the offense.
- San Jose State matched its season high of three quarterback sacks in the UNLV win. Christian Tago, who led the Spartans with 12 tackles, Benwikere and Sean Bacon were credited with a quarterback sack.
- Cornerback Dasheon Frierson was credited with three pass break-ups and now has 10 on the season.
- The 86 rushing yards allowed by the San Jose State matched the Spartans' best rushing defensive total of 2013. San Jose State limited Sacramento State to 86 yards on 39 carries in the season opener.
