

Game Notes Wyoming vs. San José State October 26, 2013



San Jose State's team captains for the Wyoming game are quarterback David Fales, offensive guard Ryan Jones, defensive tackle Travis Raciti and linebacker Keith Smith.

San Jose State completed a perfect 3-0 record in October with wins at Hawaii and Colorado State and a Homecoming victory over Wyoming. In all three wins, San Jose State trailed at one point in a game. The Spartans were down 14-3 at Hawaii, were behind by seven points twice at Colorado State and trailed by 16 points three times against Wyoming.

San Jose State scored a season-high 51 points, gained a season-high 642 yards of total offense and passed for a season-best 482 yards. The 642 yards is the ninth most yards of total offense in a game by a Spartan team and marks the first time in back-to-back games San Jose State gained 600 or more yards of total offense. San Jose State gained 608 yards in the Colorado State win on October 12.

The 482 passing yards against Wyoming is the eighth best single-game total in San Jose State history.

San Jose State's 22-point third quarter is a season-high for one quarter of scoring this season. The Spartans' 37 second-half points are the most scored by the team in a second half since scoring 42 in a 70-63 comeback win over Rice on October 2, 2004.

David Fales notched his third 400-plus passing yardage game of the season and his fourth in his career with 482 yards. During San Jose State's three-game winning streak, Fales threw for 1,231 yards and 11 touchdowns.

Chandler Jones extended his school record for career touchdown receptions to 23 with a pair of first-half touchdowns of 76 and 8 yards and a 30-yarder in the fourth quarter.

Tyler Winston became the first San Jose State freshman to record three consecutive 100-plus receiving yardage games with his season-highs of nine receptions for 171 yards and a touchdown catch for the third game in a row.

For the first time this season, San Jose State had three players with 100 or more receiving yards. Winston led the way with 171 yards on nine receptions. Tight end Billy Freeman had a career night with six catches for 119 yards. Chandler Jones notched his fourth 100-yard receiving game of the season with 129 yards on four receptions.

Jarrod Lawson crossed the 100-yard rushing mark for the first time as a Spartan finishing with 128 yards on 25 carries.

Shane Smith and Tim Crawley scored his first touchdowns for San Jose State. Smith's came on a 3-yard pass reception to give the Spartans a 34-30 lead. Crawley's 9-yard run preceded the Smith touchdown.

San Jose State's freshman tight end combination of Billy Freeman and Jordan Thiel combined on seven receptions. Thiel had his first career reception in the Wyoming game.

The Robert Herron 93-yard touchdown reception for Wyoming in the first quarter is the longest play against San Jose State in school history.
