**San Jose State Football Game Notes**

San Jose State's 37-27 win over Hawaii was its first as a Mountain West Conference member, ended a three-game losing streak and was the 12<sup>th</sup> time the Spartans defeated Hawaii in Honolulu.

Team captains for the Hawaii game are David Fales, Ryan Jones, Travis Raciti and Keith Smith.

Defensive back Bene Benwikere was on the trip, but did not suit up for the Hawaii game.

Three San Jose State freshmen, tight end Billy Freeman, running back Jarrod Lawson and wide receiver Tyler Winston figured in the touchdown scoring for San Jose State.

Three San Jose State freshmen running backs, Tim Crawley, Jarrod Lawson and Thomas Tucker combined for 230 yards on 45 carries and one touchdown.

Tim Crawley as a running back and Tyler Winston as a wide receiver made their first starts of the season for San Jose State.

Austin Lopez's 44-yard field goal gave San Jose State its first lead in a game since the opener against Sacramento State on August 29. Lopez would go on to make three field goals including a career-long 51 yarder in the second quarter.

Chandler Jones set a new San Jose State career record in the first quarter with his 19<sup>th</sup> touchdown reception.

Chandler Jones moved into second place on the San Jose State career pass receiving yardage list. His 95 yards on four receptions gives him 2,311 for his career. He trails teammate Noel Grigsby, who has 3,121 yards.

The last two San Jose State field goals of 50 or more yards took place in Aloha Stadium. Jared Strubeck made a 50-yard field goal in the Spartans' 20-17 win in 2008. Austin Lopez's second field goal of the game was from 51 yards out.

The Spartans' defense came up with a season-high four takeaways on a pair of interceptions by Christian Tago, Simon Connette and Dasheon Frierson and a fumble recovery by Connette.

Keith Smith was credited with eighth career forced fumble when Simon Connette came up with a fumble recovery in the third quarter.

Tyler Winston notched his first 100-yard receiving game of the season. Winston led the Spartans with six catches for 159 yards and the team's final touchdown of the game.

David Fales threw for at least 300 yards for the third game in a row. Fales was 16-of-25 with two interceptions for 318 yards.
