San Jose State University Football Game Notes

Wide receiver **Justin Holmes**, safety **Maurice McKnight** and cornerback **Andre Chachere** served as team captains for the Nevada game.

Defensive lineman **Bryson Bridges** was in the starting lineup for the first time since the Fresno State game.

Offensive lineman **Jake Colman** made his first major college start at right tackle. Jack Sniyder started at left tackle for **Troy Kowalski**.

For the third time this season, a San Jose State punt was blocked when Daemon Babers blocked a **Michael Carrizosa** punt in the first quarter. Carrizosa booted his third 60-plus yard punt of the season in the second quarter – a 63-yd. kick and finished with a 48.0 average on eight punts.

Tyler Nevens recorded his second 100-yard rushing game of the season at Nevada. He finished with a season-high 118 yards on 21 carries and scored his first San Jose State touchdown.

Nevens' 12-yard touchdown run was San Jose State's first rushing touchdown since **Zamore Zigler's** 17-yard score against Cal Poly on September 2.

Michael Carrizosa kicked off for the first time since the Fresno State game on October 7. All three of his kickoffs resulted in touchbacks.

Sean Pinson's first major college catch or run was a 12-yard touchdown play to close out the scoring for the day. His primary contributions this season has been as a special teams player. He also was credited with an assisted tackle.

Michael Carrillo threw the touchdown pass to Pinson. The scoring play was his first as a San Jose State quarterback.

Frank Ginda was the game's leading tackler with 12 tackles. He now has 152 tackles for the season which ranks fifth on the Mountain West list for single-season tackles.

William Ossai was credited with a single-game career-high 10 tackles and added 1.0 tackles for loss.
