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San Jose State University Football Game Notes

Wide receiver Justin Holmes, safety Maurice McKnight and cornerback Andre Chachere served as San Jose State's team captains during the coin toss.

Linebacker Alii Matau made his first start of the season on defense for San Jose State.

Dakari Monroe came up with his first career interception in the first quarter of the BYU game. The takeaway resulted in San Jose State's first points in the game on a Bryce Crawford field goal.

Bryce Crawford handled kickoff duties for the second game in a row.

For the fourth time this season, Bryce Crawford kicked at least two field goals in a game. Crawford converted tries of 48 and 25 yards in the first half.

K.J. Hall's 75-yard touchdown run was the longest run of the season against San Jose State.

Michael Carrizosa returned to action as San Jose State's punter in the BYU game.

For the first time this season, San Jose State had 11 different players catch a pass in a game. The previous high was nine in the Hawaii game on October 14.

Tre Walker's fourth-quarter touchdown reception was his first at the major college level and his longest pass reception of the season.

Tyler Nevens became the second San Jose State player this season to rush for at least 100 yards in a game. The freshman finished with career highs of 26 carries for 112 yards. Earlier in the season, Zamore Zigler rushed for 121 yards on 12 carries in the Cal Poly win.

Linebacker Jamal Scott has a team-high and personal single game best 3.0 tackles for loss in the BYU game.

Frank Ginda was San Jose State's leading tackler with nine stops including 1.0 tackles for loss. He now has 124 tackles in nine games this season.

After a season-high 11 penalties in the previous game at Hawaii on October 14, San Jose State had a season-low two penalties in the BYU contest.
