SCOUTING THE EAGLES

Eastern Washington is led by first-year head coach Joddie Gleason, who was hired as the eighth head women's basketball coach in program history on May 21, 2021. The 2021-22 edition of Eagle women's basketball features eight returners and eight newcomers, five of which are true freshmen and three transferred in.

Eastern Washington was picked to finish 11th in the Big Sky by the coaches preseason polls after finishing 6-17 overall and 5-12 in Big Sky Conference play a year ago.

PRESEASON POLL

The Spartans were picked ninth in the Mountain West preseason poll, receiving one first-place vote and 105 points.

FRESH FACES

The Spartans have NINE newcomers to the program in 2021-22. SJSU debuted three freshmen in its season opener- Sidney Richards, Sammy Shields and Jady Watson. San José State also added five transfers to the lineup- A'tyanna Gaulden (Georgia Southern), Deja Ross (Xavier), Stephanie Torres (Eastern Florida), Ellie Boni (Colorado State) and Ella Ogier (Omaha).

In her Spartan debut, A'Tyanna Gaulden led SJSU with 14 points in its season opener at Washington State on November 9, 2021 in Pullman, Wash.

SPANNING THE GLOBE

The 2020-21 Spartans will have supporters in plenty of different time zones this season. This year's roster features student-athletes from 10 different states (California, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Minnesota, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, Rhode Island, Texas) and three countries (Australia, Canada, United States).

YOUTH MOVEMENT

San José State's turnaround has been a few years in the making as the program had the youngest roster in the country for the 2017-18 season, a group that included eight freshmen. One player (Cydni Lewis) on that team is now a senior at SJSU.

Welcome to San José State University. The following information is presented to assist the working media in its coverage of the 2020-21 season. The SJSU Athletics Media Relations Office will be available throughout the year to assist you.

CREDENTIAL REQUESTS

Requests for the media area credentials and photo credentials should be directed to Toni Bianco, Multimedia Specialist, at toni.bianco@sjsu.edu. Requests must be made at least 24 hours prior to game time. Credentials will either be mailed or held at the Will Call window, located at the west side of the Provident Credit Union Event Center or at the Athletics Ticket Office.

PROVIDENT CREDIT UNION EVENT CENTER

The Provident Credit Union Event Center is located on the San José State campus where Seventh Street dead ends on the south side of campus. Parking is located in the Seventh Street Garage located on the corner of Seventh and San Salvador Streets.

POSTGAME PROCEDURES

Approximately 10 minutes after the team leaves the court, head coach Jamie Craighead and a minimum of two players will be available for a virtual post game press conference. Opponent coach and player interviews should be coordinated with the consent of the visiting Media Relations Director.

COACH CRAIGHEAD AND PLAYER INTERVIEWS

All interview requests for head coach Jamie Craighead or any players should be made through the San José State Athletics Media Relations Office at least 24 hours in advance. Players are available as their class schedules, practices and meetings permit. Players will not be available until after the contest on game days. Media members are also required to make prior arrangements with the SJSU Media Relations Office to attend any practice session.

SPARTAN BROADCASTS

San José State women's basketball will be broadcast on multiple platforms during the 2020-21 season. All home and all Mountain West contests will be broadcast on the Mountain West Network. Broadcasts of home games will begin approximately 15 minutes prior to tip. Handling the play-by-play is Daniel Barrera. Broadcasts of non-conference road contests will be handled by those institutions and will be linked to the team's schedule page.

On September 16, 2013, Jamie Craighead was named the eighth head women's basketball coach at San José State University.

Entering 2021-22, her ninth season leading the Spartans, Craighead's teams have set and then broken the program's record for points scored in a season, and in 2019-20 set a San José State and Mountain West Conference single-game record when the Spartans scored 128 points in a win over La Verne.

Under Craighead's guidance the Spartans have reached the semifinals of the 2015 and 2020 Mountain West Tournaments. These trips marked just the second and third times in the 42-year history of the program that the team advanced that far in its conference tournament. In addition, the team's 19 wins on the 2019-20 campaign were the program's most since the 1979-80 team won 22 games.

The 2013-14 squad established single-season marks for free throws attempted (726) and made (493) as well as three-pointers attempted (793) and made (245). In 2014-15, the Spartans set new marks for three-pointers attempted (872) and made (271) in addition to total field goal attempts (2,262).

Her most successful team to date, the 2019-20 squad owned the nation's largest single-season win turnaround, going from six victories in 2018-19 to 19 wins the following year. Led by the youngest coaching staff in the Mountain West, the 2019-20 Spartans finished in a tie for third place in the Mountain West standings, the best-ever finish for a team picked last in the conference's preseason poll.

In her nine seasons, Craighead's players have earned 11 conference post-season awards for their play on the court. In addition, they have earned 36 Academic All-Mountain West (3.0+ GPA), 14 Mountain West Scholar-Athlete honors (3.5+ GPA), six Dean's Scholar (3.65+ GPA) and four President's Scholar designation (4.0 GPA+) as well as nine Arthur Ashe, Jr. Sport-Scholar Award and a first-team Capital One Academic All-District VIII honor. Finally student athletes, Ta'Rea Cunnigan, the school's all-time leader in scoring, and Emily Vann graduated Magna Cum Laude in 2015 and 2016, respectively.

Craighead came to San José State after spending four seasons at Sacramento State (2010-13), where she was the winningest women's head basketball coach in 20 years and the only coach to post a winning conference record at Sacramento State since they entered the Big Sky Conference in the 1996-97 season. Under her guidance the Hornets reached the Big Sky Conference Tournament for just the fifth (2012) and sixth (2013) times in program history. In those appearances, Sacramento State earned its first tournament wins and reached the semi-final round both years.

The youngest head coach in Division I when she took over the Hornets, Craighead's teams, playing a fast-break type offense, led the Big Sky Conference in scoring in each of her four seasons.

Sacramento State set several program records in 2012-13 including field goals made, assists, blocked shots and fewest turnovers committed. In addition, the team's 19 wins equaled the program's single-season record, which was set in the 1990-91 season. The Hornets led the Big Sky in points, 3-pointers, and assists and on the defensive end, topped the league in steals and blocks.

As a collegiate player at the University of Oregon, Craighead led the Ducks to the 2002 WNIT championship after three appearances in the NCAA Tournament. When she finished her career, her 182 3-point field goals made ranked second all-time in Ducks history.

Craighead earned honorable mention Academic All-Pac-10 honors as a senior and graduated from Oregon with a bachelor's degree in educational studies in 2002. She is a native of Elma, Wash.
